#### Introduction



- Agreement on the Project 14/NMF PL 15/14 Professional Human Resources Pillar of Secure Europe
  was signed between the Ministry of Internal Affairs and the Regional Police Headquarters in Łódź on the
  13th of August 2015
- The Project included 4 specialistic trainings on exchanging criminal information in the field of system SIS II, human trafficking and research methods validation, statistics tools, quality control and securing digital traces dedicated to 320 police officers and employees of Regional Police Headquarters in Łódź and the Border Guards.
- Additionally, the Project included 4 visits in Hague, where the participants were supposed to familiarize with theoretical and practical operational abilities of Europol as well as available ways of cooperation
- Total project value 946 022,00 PLN



#### **Project Goals**



- The general goal of the project is to strengthen the cooperation within the Schengen area and increasing efficiency of combating cross border and organized crimes, including combating human trafficking and criminal group migrations.
- Through the planned project activities like specialist trainings, case studies as well as visits in Europol, the following direct goals has been achieved:
  - The abilities of project participants have been improved, including especially the broadly defined Schengen acquis and system SIS II.
  - The qualifications of crime detection technician have been increased in the scope of securing biological and chemical traces on the crime scenes, securing digital evidence as well as taking and securing digital photographic material.
  - Efficiency of chemical, biological and digital researches carried out by Forensic Laboratory in Łódź has been improved.
  - Strengthening cooperation among the units in the Schengen area responsible for combating organized and cross-border crimes and fighting against human trafficking
  - Improving the police structures in order to implement the Schengen acquis



#### **Study visits**



Police officers of Lodz Police and the Border Guards participated in four study visits in Europol in Hague on the following days: October 19th – 23rd 2015, November 9th-13th 2015r; November 23rd-28th 2015, December 07th-13th 2015

#### The goals of the visits:

- Getting to know the structure, abilities and tools of EUROPOL for future cooperation on combating cross – border crimes
- Familiarizing with capacities and working of the Polish liaison bureau at EUROPOL
- Improving abilities of participants to combat cross-border crimes, human trafficking and illigal immigration
- Extending cooperation between Regional Police Headquarters in Łódź and Polish Embassy in Hague associated with multual assistance
- Exchanging information about: data processing, property, vehicles, syntetic drugs, illegal immigration, cigarette smuggling, fake credit cards;

- Visit in a police unit in Hague,
- Visit in a police unit in Ultrecht,

- New training needs connected with the scope of information discussed during the visits, familiarizing officers with systems and available possibilities, presenting possibilities of cooperation with EUROPOL while carried out cases
- Necessity of extending contribution into EUROPOL resources
- Familiarizing officers with the way of working of Netherland police both from the unit in Hague and in Ultrecht;
- Familiarizing officers with the way of working BARKA Foundation, starting cooperation with the foundation
- Considering establishing cooperation between Regional Police Headquarters in Łódź and the police unit in Ultrecht aiming at exchange of police officers and experience exchange;
